

MEET THE CAST AND CREW OF I LOVE YOU, YOU'RE PERFECT, NOW CHANGE



Jim Callaway, SSP Board member, makes his Riverfront Theatre stage debut...and his first time onstage in more than 30 years when he appeared in such shows as *Bye, Bye Birdie* and *You're a Good Man, Charlie Brown*. He also sang in a rock band from the late 70s to early 90s. On his return to the stage Jim advises audiences to "just watch as we all embarrass ourselves for your enjoyment!" A resident of Harrington, Jim owns Wire Notz Electric and is facilities manager with the Holy Cross Parish. "Doing this show has been great," he says, "and we were all always willing to do whatever it took to make it that way."



Steven "Janky" Dow is another newcomer to SSP. "I started doing theater about two years ago almost by accident," Steven says. "A friend of mine was in a show and asked me if I would fill a role that they needed. I've been hooked ever since!" In that span he has appeared in Footloose, Les Miserables, Sweeney Todd, and more. He works at the Greentree Branch of PNC in Dover, recently moved back to live with his father and two brothers, Steven has time for little else but theatre. "I can't say enough about this cast and crew," he says, "and how everyone has just come together to make this show what it is. I love you all!"



Mark Dissinger (PRODUCER), SSP Board member and treasurer, is back behind the scenes after just directing SSP's summer comedy, Barefoot in the Park. He is a frequent SSP director for such shows as Cinderella, Fiddler on the Roof, Annie, The Sound of Music and To Kill a Mockingbird. "I've had so many laughs just watching this cast rehearse," he says, "I can't wait for our audiences to share in the fun." Watch for Mark later this fall in Milford's annual community (Halloween) parade and his unexpected theatre appearances as a flamboyant pirate. She lives in Milford, with her son, Sean.



Carly Jo Hosbach (MUSICAL DIRECTOR) has been very busy theatrically since moving from Pittsburgh to Milford just a couple of years ago. She has recently appeared onstage in Meshuggah-Nunsl, Move Over, Mrs. Markum and As You Like It, and behind the scenes with SSP's Barefoot in the Park and Cat on a Hot Tin Roof. "I think everyone can relate to at least one scene in this show. We've all secretly thought the same things!" Carly Jo graduated from Ohio University and earned a Masters Degree from Misericordia University. When not at the theatre, she works as a speech-language pathologist in inpatient rehabilitation and enjoys cooking and exploring Delaware.



Melissa Janson (STAGE MANAGER) Melissa Janson has been on the Riverfront stage many times, including *Greater Tuna*, *Dearly Departed*, *Dinner with Friends*, and *Cat on a Hot Tin Roof*. Although she says she prefers to be on-stage and has worked crew for many other musicals, this is her first time stage managing a musical and she says she's "had a blast doing it!" Melissa thinks that everyone can find something to relate to in this production. . "This show makes it easy to find humor in our day-to-day relationships." Melissa works from her Milford home as a call center coordinator for Aetna and enjoys time with her daughter, Megan, and son, Tyler.



Ben Lonski (DIRECTOR) returns to the director's chair after helming SSP's Cat on a Hot Tin Roof last year, and will be back to direct The Diary of Anne Frank in 2012. "This has been such an amazingly talented and hard working cast and crew," Ben says. "I love them, they're perfect, and I wouldn't change a single one of them!" Debbie Passwaters (ASSISTANT DIRECTOR) has appeared in such SSP shows as *Meshuggah-Nuns!* and *Greater Tuna*, directed The *Three Bully Goats Griff*, and assistant-directed *Toy School*. "When Ben asked me to assistant direct I thought, 'Wow, they're gonna let Ben direct this show? They have no idea what's gonna hit 'em! Yeah, I wanna be a part of that!" Debbie most relates to the gals singing "Single Man Drought" because "the dating scene these days is an interesting mix of crazies!" Debbie lives in Milford and is an RN for Delaware Hospice. She loves to go out dancing (with the crazies?!) and has a new love... for running and cycling.



Amy Stone will be remembered by SSP audiences for her powerful and seductive performance as Maggie in last fall's Cat on a Hot Tin Roof. She has appeared at other theatres in such shows as Steel Magnolias, Suddenly Last Summer, and Nunsense. Amy says, "It's been such a joy being back on the Riverfront stage, especially with this crazy and talented bunch of people. cast and crew!" She lives in Salisbury with husband, Nathan, and sons, Cade, Dane, and Beckett. Amy is an ABA therapist and educational consultant for children with autism.



Kim Swanstrom returns to the Riverfront stage after her 2009 appearance in SSP's Babes in Toyland. "That just got my feet wet. So here I am and loving every minute!" Kim says that the show is so successful because it is so relatable. "There will be at least one scene where you'll nudge the person next to you and laugh because 'you've been there and done that!"
